

## TOWN OF INOLA

### BOARD OF TRUSTEES REGULAR MEETIN MAY 28, 2002

The Town of Inola Board of Trustees met in regular session, Tuesday, May 28, 2002, due to the Memorial Day Holiday on Monday, May 27<sup>th</sup>. The meeting was called to order by Mayor Tommie Grigg at 7:05 p.m. Members present were Mike Powers, Erin Oquin, Duane Helling and Tommie Grigg. Also present were Becky Cox, Dale Runyan and Tommy Dyer, Jr. Clerk, Wilma Cargill and Trustee Glennie Spurlock were absent.

A motion to approve the May 13, 2002 meeting minutes as presented was made by Erin Oquin 2<sup>nd</sup> by Duane Helling. Voting yes were Mike, Erin, Duane and Tommie.

The item concerning approval of flood changes was tabled. The information on this will be turned over to Kenny Schwab, FHC, as soon as it is received.

Duane Helling made a motion to double the Court Clerk Salary, changing it from \$25.00 per court session to \$50.00 per session. Mike Powers 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion. Voting yes were Mike, Erin, Duane and Tommie.

Darlene and Ron Shear were present to discuss a problem with loud noise at Moore's Tire Shop during the late evening and night hours. The problem is getting worse, now that school is out. Les advised, there must be a sign posted by the owner before the police can do anything. Tommy Dyer, Jr. advised we might be able to look at it from a public nuisance standpoint. Tommy will check and figure out what we need to do.

Attorney, Tommy Dyer, Jr. advised there was nothing much to report, except a couple of fire department collections and there was no further action in the lawsuit filed by George Freeman.

Item concerning pay rate increase for Wendi Crane McMillan was tabled.

Police Chief, Les Wilmott gave the police chief's report. Wendi will be going back to COPS grant school with Robert Kinnick this summer. Les was notified by Brad Carson's Office that Inola did get the \$750 vest partnership grant. On the Cops Officer Grant, Les sent in, he found a source to pay for our 25% match, if we would happen to get the grant. He is also still working on the Police Building Grant. Les mentioned he was concerned about the extra traffic that will be traveling Hwy. 412 due to the bridge collapse at I40. The police dept. wrote about 30 seatbelt violation tickets Memorial Day weekend. The month of May was reasonably quiet, only receiving about 176 calls.

Dale Runyan advised Board Members that a guard rail needed to be installed at B St. NE & Commercial (by the Railway Café) for safety purposes. The ditch there is very deep and installing a guard rail may keep a child from falling in it. Rock needs to be added in the ditch also. Duane Helling made a motion to install a guard rail at B St. NE & Commercial 2<sup>nd</sup> by Erin Oquin. Voting yes were Mike, Erin, Duane and Tommie.

A motion to approve the financial report as presented was made by Duane Helling 2<sup>nd</sup> by Mike Powers. Ending balances for the month of April were as follows:
