

REGULAR MEETING

TOWN OF INOLA

January 3, 2002

The Inola Town Board of Trustees met in regular session at 7:00 p.m. January 3, 2002 2001 in the Inola Town Hall Meeting Room. Mayor Grigg called the meeting to order and answering to roll call were Glennie Spurlock, Mike Powers, Erin Oquin and Tommie Grigg. Also present Clerk Wilma Cargill, Town Administrator Dale Runyan. and Town Attorney Tommy Dyer Jr. Duane Helling and Treasurer Becky Cox were absent.

Erin made a motion to approve the minutes of 12-10-01 as presented 2nd by Mike Voting yes were Glennie, Mike, Erin and Tommie. A/A

Billy Wilson was present with a letter requesting the board members to review the town's school zoning signs and speed limit signs. He stated that signs weren't posted in appropriate areas to let citizens know where the town limit begins and ends. He was given a ticket and felt he wasn't treated unfairly because he didn't know the speed limit at that particular location. Mayor Grigg thanked him for his concerns.

Mayor Grigg advised there has been some concerns on town policies in the administrative area and will change the police policies in the same area to be equal.

Mike made a motion to declare the backhoe as surplus equipment and to advertise for bids 2nd by Tommie. A/A

He was advised that town can't do anything for free and Kenny Schwab will do some research concerning the drainage problems that may occur. This item will be on the next agenda.

In attorney's report Tommy advised he is still playing phone tag with the cable company and the pending lawsuit is still in discovery.

Les advised the board he would like to take bids on the Chey Caprice Police Car for 30 days to re-coop some of the expenses in repairs that have occurred.

Mike made a motion to declare the Chey Caprice Police Car as surplus equipment and advertise to accept sealed bids until 5:00 p.m February 8, 2002 and open the bids at the meeting February 11, 2002 2nd by Erin. Voting yes were Glennie, Mike, Erin and Tommie. A/A

There was no action on the purchase of a new police car.

Consideration and action to amend the police policy manual. Tabled

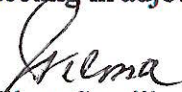
